1. What is your vision for education in the Fullerton schools?

Quality education for all students. Equity among all schools and all students. Emphasis on Safety, mental health/wellness and parent engagement. Innovative programs that engage individual learning. My vision is to continue to move the district forward where every student feels valued, is safe and is learning.

2. What do you believe are the top two or three priorities that need to be addressed at the district level?

I believe we have made great progress during my term in these areas but need to continue addressing: 1) Safety and wellness, 2) Quality and equity in education for all students, with progressive, innovative programs that meet the needs of individual students as well as growing our programs such as Dual Immersion, and STEM to more sites. 3) Involve the parents and community in our schools in a welcoming, inviting and transparent way.

3. What has been your experience in the public-school system?

I have taught K/6 during my 34-year career. 30 years in Fullerton. I am a parent of a child that attended all K-8 elementary schools in Fullerton. I have been a union bargaining officer for FETA. I have been a member of many committees such as School Site Council, Cal distinguished team, Golden Bell winner, 3-time Teacher of the year Mainstreaming special day students and working with exceptional students.
