1. What is your vision for Fullerton?

I'd like to see the city of Fullerton live up to its full potential as becoming a place for all to admire. We have a great concentration of wealth, natural resources, and a population that is dedicated towards its betterment. With a minor change in direction all of its residents would become beneficiaries of its improvements. The road conditions would quickly go from one of the worst in Orange County to one of the best in the entire state which would all be done without raising taxes for residents. Instead of having a budget that operates on a deficit we finally have one that works only off of a surplus. We'd also be able to show the world that we care about helping those that are less fortunate in our communities by providing solutions to societal problems that are innovative and humanitarian like 3D printed homes for the homeless, eliminating judicial punishment for those battling substance abuse, and developing public gardens where people will be able to get food for free. Fullerton can be a model city for all others and will be that example once I am elected onto city council.

2. Why are you running and what impact do you think you will have, if elected?

I'm running because like most people I've had enough of career politicians that put their own needs first when their job as public representatives is to make their constituents need their top priority. Too much corruption in government, wasted tax dollars, and not much too show for the many sacrifices that We The People have made to make America great is leaving a bad taste in people's mouths. The only way to restore the balance of power is to put it back into the people's hands where it belongs. This is my entire focus and why my election onto the City Council would shake up the establishment tremendously. 3. What do you hope to accomplish?

4. Please share your thoughts on the following:

a. Fullerton's Parks

Fullerton Parks are great but of course could be better. Partnerships with private companies would generate the funding needed to improve them as well as additional income for the city.

b. West Coyote Hills (development, Measure W results and city response)

It's our duty as preservers of our planet to protect nature, but public funds shouldn't be needed to buy property that's already publicly owned. Any development on the land should be approved by voters and if it isn't supported simply should not be done and not agreed upon by some backroom deal.

c. Development Policies

Current development policies need to be reviewed and repealed if they conflict with the interests of residents and/or are unconstitutional. Because of this glaring conflict of interest I will most likely not be supportive of any acquisition plans unless this is done first.

d. Road and other infrastructure repairs

Businesses such as Domino's Pizza offer programs to pave roads and fix potholes as a method of advertising which require no use of taxpayers' money to be spent. These are the types of solutions I would like to implement to improve road conditions throughout the city.

e. The Hunt Library

Allowing the library to be leased out would keep it open without the need of public funds and would generate revenue for the city. I'm sure residents would not object to Starbucks moving in and taking the financial burden off of the city all the while paying them additional money in sales taxes.

f. Homelessness

Money from parking fees can be used to build 3D printed homes in vacant areas for those that want to get off of the streets. Not every person in that situation wants to be helped so focusing on those who are accepting of the helping hand would be a better use of resources.

5. Is there anything you would like to add?

This is the first election being done by district in Fullerton so I'd like voters to know that the many issues that my district is dealing with are shared throughout all of the districts in the city. Therefore, coming together to deal with these problems will unite all of those seeking a solution. Compassion, understanding, and listening to everyone's concerns will be imperative to this process and I will gladly be all ears.
